

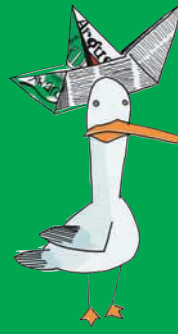

One Brighton has been hailed as the most sustainable residential development built in the UK to date.

It not only pushes the boundaries of environmentally friendly and zero carbon technology but the whole area is designed to provide living space for a healthier, happier community.

Created by developers Crest Nicholson and sustainable design company BioRegional Quintain, it is a revolutionary scheme adhering to the One Planet Living principles - a set of ten rules that express how we can all live together without overstretching the limits of the planet. Managing director of BioRegional Quintain, Pete Halsall, says: "In a sense we've pulled apart the apartment building concept and put it back together in a much better way.

"We're not just about sustainable design, we have a strong emphasis on community and health as well."

But the developers haven't just stopped with creating an innovative high-rise block of flats. Alongside the handy features such as kitchens fitted with segregated rubbish bins and rainwater harvesting systems, BioRegional Quintain will be working with Brighton and Hove City Council and the community to create a One Planet Living plan for the city. This plan will be fed back into all the existing work already being done to help tackle the many and varied sustainability issues we face.

One Brighton is truly cutting edge, bringing marginal technologies to the mainstream and creating an accessible, mass product for a sustainable world.

Perhaps most importantly, BioRegional Quintain live by the principles they espouse, and work hard to ensure their employees are as happy and healthy as the people who live in their developments.
